- China visa and handling/shipping (approximately \$200) are included.

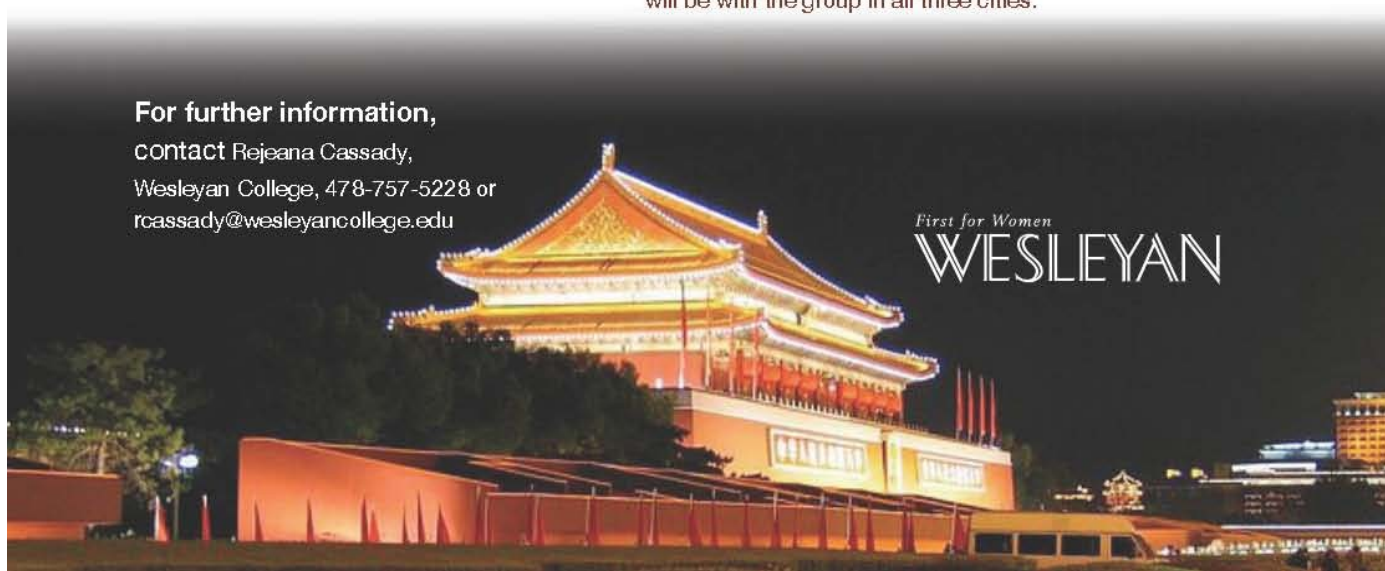
Not included: Transportation from point of origin in the U.S. to Atlanta. Meals not listed as being included. Passport fees, single supplement, excess baggage & forwarding of baggage, personal items, insurance.

- 13 June Atlanta/Beijing
- 14 June Arrive Beijing and transfer to hotel.
- 15 June Full day touring with lunch including the Temple of Heaven, the Summer Palace, Tiananmen Square, and the Forbidden City. Evening Peking Duck dinner and local cultural performance show.
- 16 June Full day touring with lunch including the Great Wall and the Ming Tombs.
- 17 June Transfer for morning flight to Guangzhou. Upon arrival, transfer to hotel.
- 18 June Full day coach and guide service for special Wesleyan connected visits.
- 19 June Full day coach and guide service for group's local activities.

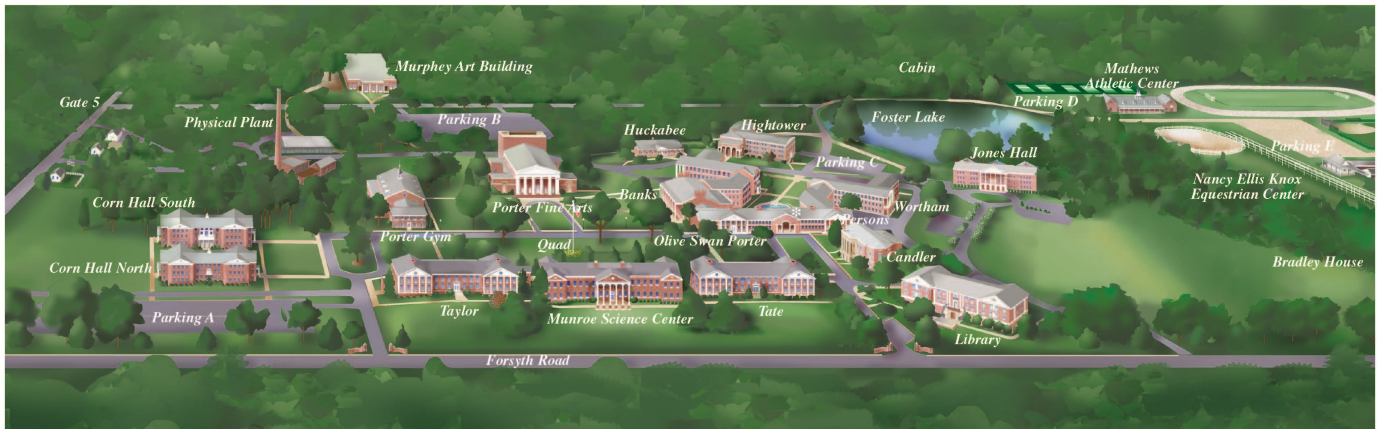
